## BACKGROUND

This memorandum accompanies the City of Baltimore Mayor's Office of Recovery Program's submission of its monthly report to the City Council on spending and performance related to American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. Specifically, Council Bill 21-0121 § 49-2(B) prescribes the elements of legislatively required reporting, which stipulates that monthly reports should:

1. Provide data and metrics regarding how the funds have:
  - I. Increased the effectiveness of city government services;
  - II. Broadened the reach of city government services;
  - III. Made city government services more efficient;
  - IV. Made city government services more sustainable
  
2. Identify key performance indicators, benchmarks, and targets related to:
  - I. Equity, as defined in Article 1, § 39-1 of the Baltimore City Code;
  - II. Population Growth;
  - III. Labor and Employment;
  - IV. Economic Growth, especially the growth of minority and women-owned businesses; and,
  - V. Community Benefit

## COMMITMENTS AND EXPENDITURES

At the end of December, the Mayor's Office of Recovery Programs committed \$641.1 million in ARPA funds to City agencies, quasi-governmental organizations, and nonprofits to advance priority initiatives for Baltimore City residents. Through January 2025, \$403.4 million had been spent on ARPA-funded projects (See Table 1), accounting for 62.9% of the current commitments and the city's \$641M total ARPA allocation.

# Commitments

Table 1 lists ARPA commitments totaling \$641,170,126 and expenditures totaling \$403,360,447 through January 2025.

# Recovery Office Accomplishments

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The Mayor's Office of Recovery Programs awarded ARPA funding to 46 nonprofit organizations. As of January 2025, all 46 nonprofits have received disbursements totaling \$35.2 million. See Table 1 for total disbursements. Some highlights of select nonprofit activities in November are as follows:

- Downtown Partnership of Baltimore's (DPOB) Business Assistance Grant: Facade Improvement & Operation Storefront application review was completed. An initial Operation Storefront award was made to Breaking Bread, and subsequent awards will be finalized in February. The BOOST III application review was also completed. Ten eligible BOOST III applicants will make "pitch presentations," and five businesses will be announced by the end of February.
- FreeState Justice observed a notable increase in client engagement in their housing and legal resource programs. Clients have sought assistance, effectively navigating the pathways to available support services. The implementation of their intake procedures, which now feature simplified forms and personalized outreach, has facilitated greater access to essential resources.
- Healthy Neighborhoods, Inc. (HNI), who has taken over as the fiscal agent for the Ambassador Redevelopment project, has convened weekly neighborhood engagement sessions with a representative of a newly forming organization, "Ambassador Arts," and local residents. In addition, HNI's quarterly "Liberty Coalition of Neighborhoods" public meeting was held with the attendance of approximately 25 residents and stakeholders, including elected officials. The topics covered a broad range of neighborhood activities, including the re-launch of the Ambassador project.

The Recovery Office continues to provide technical assistance to all funded city agencies, quasi-government agencies, and nonprofits and coordinates with centralized functions such as legal, procurement, and finance to facilitate timely disbursements and expenditures.

# City Agency Accomplishments

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## BALTIMORE CITY RECREATION AND PARKS (BCRP)

### POOLS

Towanda and Coldstream Pools continue to progress and will be completed this Spring. They will be operational for Summer 2025. Greater Model Pool is also progressing but will not be completed until late Summer 2025. It will not open until Summer 2026.

### RECREATION CENTERS

Gardenville Recreation Center has completed ground construction, and contractors are progressing with the walls. All utility issues have been resolved. The project is tracking for completion in Q1 of 2026. Bocek Recreation Center and Elijah Cummings Recreation Center have been awarded and are in the final stages of permitting and coordination with the contractors. A groundbreaking ceremony for Bocek was held February 24th. Both projects should be started by mid-March at the latest.

### PLAYGROUNDS

Nineteen (19) out of twenty (20) playground projects have been completed and paid in full. The Dewees Playground will be completed in Spring 2025.

### ATHLETIC COURTS

All eight (8) athletic court sites have been completed and paid in full.

### TRAILS

The Gwynns Falls Trail wayfinding signage project is in fabrication. Weather permitting, installation should start in late February.

## BALTIMORE CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT (BCHD)

### VACCINATION

Eighteen mobile vaccination clinics were held in January, administering an average of 19 doses per clinic. Seniors are becoming eligible for a second dose of the 2024-25 COVID-19 vaccine if they receive a fall dose. February plans include many returning visits to senior apartment buildings from 2024.

In January 2025, the VALUE Communities team completed 24 COVID-19-related engagement events in senior residences (assisted living facilities, senior apartments), medical centers, resource centers, churches, schools, Judy Centers (early learning resource hubs that support families with children), markets, community centers, and recreation centers. The outreach activities include tabling at health educator sessions, resource fairs, clinics, health events, food and diaper distribution events, and wellness walks.

In February 2025, the team has planned 30 more similar activities, resulting in 54 engagement events for January and February 2025. Specific for this period are family fun night events, coffee and tea support groups, wellness events, and food distribution events, which are good opportunities to talk to Baltimore City residents about the COVID-19 landscape and the importance of testing and vaccination.

BCHD educates citizens not only about immunizations but also about the importance of early disease detection and in this capacity, BCHD provides resources about obesity, diabetes, high blood pressure and other cardiovascular diseases, cholesterol tests, children's checks (milestones), infant safe sleep, breastfeeding, cancer screenings (breast, prostate, skin, colon, and lung cancer), counseling (treating depression, reducing alcohol use, quitting smoking and drugs, eating healthfully, exercising, losing weight), sexual health, infectious diseases, dental services, and how to obtain medical insurance. To alleviate conditions caused by social determinants of health, BCHD also links clients to employment, safety, housing, utilities, and nutritional food services.

### COMMUNICATIONS

BCHD received its final report from Politics with Purpose, the team that executed BCHD's comprehensive COVID-19 communications campaign. As a result, from May 2024 through December 2024, Politics with Purpose (PWP) & Conexion produced and ran three (3) COVID communication campaigns to reduce vaccine hesitancy among city residents disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 and ensure vaccinated residents receive their booster shots.

The English and Spanish language campaigns comprised seven ads in English and Spanish, a total media spend of \$478,857.95, and generated nearly 10 million ad impressions to Baltimore residents. Media tactics include cable, broadcast TV, connected TV, radio, Digital (YouTube, Meta, Programmatic), SMS text messages, and digital billboards.

The Summer campaign ran from May 20 to June 15, 2024. Strategically, PWP and Conexion made the strategic decision to design ads specifically for older Black and Latino residents, as well as a general population (relatives, friends, and loved ones who would come into contact with vulnerable Baltimoreans.)

Coinciding with the start of the school year, PWP and Conexion ran a brief Back to School campaign from September 9 -30, 2024. The ads targeted parents of school-age children in Baltimore on Meta (Facebook and Instagram) and YouTube.

The Winter campaign ran from December 3-20, 2024, to coincide with the winter cold and flu season. PWP and Conexion produced one new ad holiday-themed ad, Share the Moments in English and Spanish, targeted to the general population as well as older Black and Latino residents as well as a general population (relatives, friends, and loved ones who would come in contact with vulnerable Baltimoreans).

The overarching goals of the campaign were to continue to establish branding for BCHD, build on messaging about winter vaccination efforts, and expand knowledge about vaccine availability.

## FOOD INSECURITY

**Home Delivered Food Boxes:** The Board of Estimates (BOE) approved the contract with Maryland Food Bank on the January 8, 2025, BOE meeting agenda. The program will be converting from a 30-pound box to a 15-pound box to accommodate better the preferences of older adults and the increased requests from residents. The program was relaunched on January 6.

## BALTIMORE CITY INFORMATION & TECHNOLOGY (BCIT)

### BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY

BCIT-BDE has defined the key performance metrics for the second cohort of the Digital Equity Fund grant program. These metrics will help BDE evaluate the progress and impact of the grantees throughout their projects. Currently, the grantees are implementing their initiatives, and the BDE grant team is actively overseeing the progress to ensure that they receive the necessary support and resources.

Over the past month, the technical team has made significant progress on public Wi-Fi deployments. The rollout of the FreeBmoreWiFi network has been completed at the 8th senior center, completing all in-scope senior centers:

- Oliver Senior Center, 1700 N Gay St, Completed on 10/11/2024

- Senior Network of North Baltimore (Govans), 5828 York Rd, Completed on 12/3/2024
- Forest Park Senior Center, 4801 Liberty Heights Ave, Completed on 1/22/2025

### HARDWARE REFRESH

The PC refresh initiative is progressing, with over 120 devices upgraded in the past month, bringing the total to 912 out of 1,300 refreshed. BCIT has successfully met its goal of updating the infrastructure for 51 CitiWatch cameras. As of January 2025, 15 hybrid meeting rooms have been equipped, and seven mobile solutions have been deployed, including one spare. All work is completed on the hybrid meeting room project, though the project manager will continue to provide technical support and training through next year.

## MAYOR'S OFFICE OF HOMELESS SERVICES (MOHS)

### RAPID RESOLUTION AND SHELTER DIVERSION FUND

MOHS has paid out \$1,480,018.87 to assist 345 households to date. The Shelter Diversion Case Workers are being hired, and MOHS is working on selecting a shelter diversion training partner.

### HOUSING NAVIGATION AND LANDLORD ENGAGEMENT

In January 2025, the Landlord Incentive Fund paid seven landlords signing bonuses equaling \$16,000. No mitigation funds have been paid to date. The Landlord Incentive Fund has expended \$56,000 of the \$1 million (minus a 10% United Way admin fee), providing incentive bonuses to 27 units listed in Padmission.

### SHELTER OPERATIONS AND HOTEL ACQUISITION

ARPA is funding part, or all, of the operating costs of three emergency shelters and winter sheltering.

## **HOUSING ACCELERATOR FUND (HAF)**

During January, CSH held technical assistance calls with nine developers participating in the HAF program, including four emerging BIPOC or women-led organizations. Training focused on service provider identification and recruitment, identifying sources to close capital gaps, and obtaining site control.

MOHS has created an ARPA website and annual report and publishes a monthly newsletter highlighting the ARPA-funded MOHS Initiatives and providing current updates and information. MOHS works closely with the Continuum of Care and engages advocates and the community.

## **MAYOR'S OFFICE OF NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY AND ENGAGEMENT (MONSE)**

### **FINANCE**

MONSE has continued to focus on fiscal closeout for closed or ending ARPA grantees and conducting financial audits of accounts. Additionally, MONSE reset standards for grant monitoring, programmatic alignment, and meeting/notetaking/documentation standards.

### **COMMUNITY VIOLENCE INTERVENTIONS (CVI)**

The leadership team conducted Safe Streets site visits to address concerns and observe the successes of various locations. One of the sites that was recently visited was Cherry Hill. Building strong relationships and maintaining open lines of communication have been integral to these efforts. MONSE CVI and Victim Services have integrated listening sessions with site staff and will start planning sessions to increase MONSE-Safe Streets collaboration in Feb/March. One focus topic is streamlining the referral pipeline for connection to needed services.

## **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & OPPORTUNITY (CE&O)**

MONSE successfully advanced the Neighborhood Policing Plan (NPP) by meeting with city agencies to review the North Avenue Task Force commitments and enhance the initiative's impact. By identifying a gap in NPP commitments, MONSE initiated an in-person workshop to facilitate collaboration between city agencies and the North Avenue Task Force. This workshop provides a platform for presenting service requests to agency liaisons while also allowing time and additional support for drafting mutual commitments.

### **GROUP VIOLENCE REDUCTION STRATEGY (GVRS)**

Due to challenges with BPD staffing availability, GVRS expansion into the Southern District is now targeted for April 2025.

### **SUBSIDIZED EMPLOYMENT**

MONSE amended its memorandum of understanding with the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services and other partners to reduce the grant amount to \$986,400. The agreement will end on December 31, 2025. MONSE continues to work with its MOED partners to streamline the hiring process for GVRS participants in MOED's HireUp program.

## **MAYOR'S OFFICE OF IMMIGRANT AFFAIRS (MIMA)**

### **BALTIMORE NEW AMERICAN ACCESS COALITION (BNAAC)**

BNAAC has enrolled 26 new cases since lifting the enrollment pause on October 1, 2024. Esperanza Center has enrolled 25 new cases, and the Global Refuge Welcome Center has enrolled one. MIMA continues to provide referrals to implementing partners for outreach and engagement to meet enrollment targets. Global Refuge provided trainings reviewing expectations at the BNAAC 90- and 180-day touchpoints to benefit navigators

in January. Esperanza Center reports successfully distributing 13 award cards, continuing to promote BNAAC through word of mouth and cold calls. Global Refuge Welcome Center reported conducting an outreach event with Immigration Law and Justice Network at Salem United Methodist Church on 1/17/25, which resulted in 41 potential referrals for BNAAC. Additionally, they completed outreach calls to all MIMA referrals.

In January, MIMA engaged Somos Baltimore Latino to promote the BNAAC program on their Facebook page twice weekly beginning 1/29/25. In the two weeks since, BNAAC received 185 referral submissions and counting. In the four prior weeks, BNAAC received 13 referral submissions. MIMA continues conducting preliminary screenings to avoid duplicate enrollments before forwarding referrals to implementing partners Global Refuge Welcome Center and Esperanza Center.

In addition, the BNAAC Program Engagement Associate participated in the City for All Forum on 1/25/2025 and the Latino Providers Network Lunch on 1/27/2025. At these events, BNAAC was discussed, BNAAC promotional flyers and materials were distributed, and event participants were encouraged to make referrals to BNAAC.

## LANGUAGE ACCESS

In January, 423 Baltimore City employees completed Language Access training on Workday, with BCFD, DOF, and BCHD staff completions. MIMA continues to monitor and track staff training monthly.

This month, MIMA reached out to Williams A/V, the manufacturer of interpretation equipment, to request technical assistance and received support on the use of the equipment. MIMA will continue to test the equipment in different scenarios before officially making it available for city agency use.

This month, MIMA finalized two “know your rights” documents, which will guide both service providers and community members to understand the new language access service request (SR) process that MIMA is developing with Balt311. The language access team met with our Comms colleague to finalize the design of the documents. MIMA will meet

with Balt311 in February to discuss the next steps of the SR.

By January 10th, MIMA had received several applications from individuals interested in joining the Language Access Oversight Committee (LAOC). The following week, MIMA invited a selection of applicants to join the committee and to confirm their participation by January 22nd. In February, MIMA will hold the first LAOC meeting of the 2025-2027 term.

On January 31, the Language Access Project Manager departed. This month, MIMA conducted interviews with prospective candidates to fill the Language Access Project Manager position and made an offer to a candidate who accepted the offer. The new hire will begin in early February.

In January 2025, MIMA concluded recruitment for the next term of the LAOC (2025-2027), and confirmed new members of the LAOC, with the intention to hold the next LAOC meeting in February 2025.

## DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (DHCD)

### IMPACT INVESTMENT AREAS

DHCD continues to submit acquisitions for approval to the BOE. To date, 252 acquisitions have been identified, and 25 fully completed. Approximately 178 acquisitions have been identified but were unable to be completed for various reasons, including:

- Owner expressing interest in rehabbing
- Building under permit or already in the process of rehab
- Building was occupied

As a part of Phase One in the acquisition process, DHCD has allocated over \$400k to local abstractors and appraisers to continue assessing properties for acquisition and has successfully created supplier contracts for each entity. This effort would allow for a more streamlined and efficient process of paying invoices to contractors for services rendered.

## HEALTHY HOMES

The Healthy Homes program has received over 500 applications to date and continues to assist homeowners with property upgrades, including HVAC repair/replacement, roof repairs, and water infiltration and/or mold-related issues. The program has serviced hundreds of low- to moderate-income households with at least one repair, and many benefit from multiple repairs.

## PARK HEIGHTS

On February 27, 2025, there will be a Hard Hat Tour of the newly constructed senior housing building hosted by NHP. The Ribbon Cutting for the building has been tentatively scheduled for early May 2025. The project, which features upgrades to infrastructure, newly built senior housing, and multi-family dwellings, is projected to be fully complete by June 30, 2025.

## PERMITTING SYSTEM UPGRADES

The new E-Permits platform and system are scheduled to go live on February 3, 2025. DHCD has provided virtual trainings for internal/external users with instructor presentations and demonstrations delivered via Microsoft Teams.

## DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING (DOP)

### FOOD INSECURITY

#### FARMERS MARKET

The Healthy Together app for e-incentives is ready to go and will be ready to launch at the start of the 2025 market season. The Maryland Money Market is working with the Healthy Together team to build in the SNAP and e-WIC payment processes; The Farmer's Market Nutrition Program is already on the digital platform and will be used for the 2025 cycle. The organization is also on track to spend down on its ARPA funding for technology and e-incentives by the end of 2026.

#### ONLINE SNAP

Safeway resolved numerous technology errors to distribute delivery incentives to B'more Fresh customers effectively. Amazon, another partner in

the B'More Fresh program, will potentially cover the costs of providing delivery services to SNAP recipients. During the last reporting period, DOP conducted training for B'more Fresh with nursing students.

#### PRODUCE BOXES

January marked the first month of operations under the new delivery schedule, which features transitioning from weekly to monthly deliveries. No feedback has been received from community partners regarding the change. However, the overall response has been positive, as the program was initially expected to conclude at the end of 2024. One partner chose to opt-out, citing that the reduced delivery frequency did not meet their needs. Through a budget reallocation approved by MORP, DOP was able to extend the program through the end of 2026, providing one pallet per month (50 boxes). Many sites are incorporating these deliveries to supplement their existing distribution efforts.

## MIDDLE NEIGHBORHOODS CDC

The Ambassador transition project had its first kick-off meeting with The Ambassador Arts (community group/future owner-operator) and the Baltimore Arts Realty Company. Healthy Neighborhoods Inc (HNI) and GO Northwest hosted the 8th Liberty Coalition of Neighborhoods meeting with guest speaker Darryl DeSousa, former Police Commissioner, focused on Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) and community input.

HNI met with Invest York Road staff to discuss progress on the Restore grant projects (featuring the renovation of three vacant commercial buildings). The projects appear to be on track for December 2025 completion, with the businesses opening in early 2026. HNI staff also made progress on the Lortz Lane mural unveiling event and offered to provide funds for the event. This mural celebration event features partners from the BID, the library, and the nearby elementary school. HNI also attended the York Road Partnership's Housing and Community Development meeting this month and continues supporting its spring cleanup project planning, improving the neighborhood's appearance and building community among neighbors.

## **CLEAN CORPS**

In January, Clean Corps prepared to transition to the Regional Model, a model whereby each Clean Corps team serves 3-4 neighborhoods each, focusing on fulfilling community requests, DOP directives, and items observed on the ground. Minor staff reductions were completed to reorganize Clean Corps from 14 to 11 teams. By February, two of those 11 teams will have additional team members to fulfill a new Clean Corps Preventative Strategy. Many personnel no longer employed with Clean Corps have found full-time work locally. The shift in the program model has allowed DOP to extend the program from its original end date of January 2025 to a new projected end date of June 2026.

The Regional transition and multiple extreme cold and snow events led to fewer vacant lot services. However, Clean Corps did complete 587 “Other Services” that include cleaning illegal dumping, public trashcans, sidewalks, unmaintained tree pits, and clogged storm drains. These services, particularly several large illegal dumping cleanups led to record tonnage collection across several neighborhoods. Clean Corps also cleaned nine lots in Midtown-Edmondson, with 99 alleys in ten regional neighborhoods added in May 2024. Approximately 16 tons of waste were collected in these additional neighborhoods.

The Preventative Strategy features new Clean Corps services that aim to reduce the amount of trash and illegal dumping that ends up in vacant lots, alleys, and other public surfaces before it happens. The first phase of this strategy will centralize curbside pick-up in selected neighborhoods, focusing on areas with high amounts of residential trash (usually household waste improperly put out and then left behind by DPW). This service will not be available throughout the entire neighborhood but will focus on the neighborhood’s quadrants with the most need. Teams will serve these neighborhoods with an extra supervisor and additional team members to carry out the preventative operation. The supervisor will man an extra 30-yard dumpster while the team members complete the pickup. Community leaders will alert residents in advance of where and when the service will take place. In some instances, the service will coincide with the community association’s dumpster days on

weekends, furthering Clean Corps’ commitment to increasing the capacity of its community partners.

Clean Corps will hold an anniversary event on March 14, celebrating their achievements thus far and officially announcing the launch of the Regional Model and Preventative strategy, with curbside pickup service to begin the next day. Invitations to all our partners, community, and agency, as well as the AFRO newspaper. This year, Clean Corps will launch the ‘Clean Community Competition,’ inspired by the AFRO Clean Block competition. DOP will offer small awards to community organizations to do their own cleanup and beautification projects with support from Clean Corps and ECB (our primary collaborators on this venture). DOP is also keeping DPW in the loop to get their support as needed.

## **DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES (DGS)**

### **BALTIMORE POLICE DEPARTMENT (BPD) FLEET**

DGS has received all 100 BPD Police Interceptor Utilities (PIUs) ordered using ARPA funds. Of the vehicles received, 33 are currently being upfitted, one is at the dealer for warranty repair, and 66 are now in service.

### **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (DPW) LOAD PACKERS**

DGS fleet has received all 20 ARPA-funded load packers. All 20 units have been upfitted, tagged, and labeled and are now in service.

### **HVAC IMPROVEMENTS AT CITY LIBRARIES**

Design work is underway for the six library branches receiving HVAC repair and replacement. Construction has begun at the Brooklyn and Northwood branches, with Brooklyn scheduled for completion in April 2025 and Northwood in June 2025. Construction for all six libraries is expected to conclude by October 2025.



## **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS**

Construction for the Northwest Community Action Center project is complete.

The City Hall roof contract was awarded on November 6, 2024, and the Notice to Proceed was issued on December 19, 2024. Construction is slated to begin in early 2025. The ARPA-funded portion of the contract will be completed before the expenditure deadline of December 31, 2026.

DGS is also managing facility improvements at Baltimore City Fire Stations. These include roof replacements, bathroom renovations, and other facility upgrades. For the roof repair and replacements, construction is substantially complete on the Hazmat Fire Station, Engine 42, and Engine 45. The final BCFD facility roof was bid in early January 2025. For the bathroom renovations, work is nearly complete at Engine 45 and 50% complete at Engine 30. The geothermal system at Truck 5 has been fully replaced, and the boiler at the Fire Academy has been removed. New generators will be installed in spring 2025 in four BCFD facilities.

## **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (DPW)**

### **WASTE REMOVAL**

DPW fully expended \$3,285,000 in ARPA funding to cover a contract for Spindler Refuse Service, Inc. to provide residential trash and recycling hauling for one year to help return to weekly recycling services. Services began in October 2023 and ceased being supported by ARPA funds in November 2024.

### **RECYCLING CREWS**

Thirty ARPA-funded recycling crew positions (10 solid waste drivers and 20 solid waste workers) were hired in January 2024 and supported by ARPA funds through November 2024. These positions are now covered by the General Fund.

## **CAPITAL AND OPERATING IMPROVEMENTS**

DPW will utilize ARPA funds for capital improvements at Bowley's Lane and operating improvements across the Department of Solid Waste.

DPW is currently awaiting the delivery of temporary restroom facilities before construction can begin at Bowley's Lane. Operating improvements include purchasing new technology and additional fleet. DPW has received tablets to use at residential drop-off facilities. Five 8-yard load packers have been delivered and are in service, and seven 16-yard load packers have been delivered, with three now in service. All other fleet have been ordered, and spend will be reported as vehicles are delivered.

## **BALTIMORE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT (BCFD)**

BCFD is utilizing ARPA funding for the strategic acquisition of life-saving equipment (for additional projects benefitting BCFD, please see DGS). The equipment includes self-contained breathing apparatuses, thermal imaging cameras, hose replacements, rain hoods, and other safety items and accessories. A portion of self-contained breathing apparatuses and thermal imaging cameras have been delivered, with all expected by Spring 2025. Hoses have been ordered and will be delivered on March 17, 2025. Rain hoods will be ordered in April 2025 and delivered in June 2025. Several other items have been delivered to date, including face masks, foam concentrate, and forcible entry tools.

## **DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (DOT)**

Through January 2025, DOT contractors have reconstructed 420 ADA ramps, with 27 completed in the last month. DOT has met 30% of its performance target for this measure. DOT's citywide ADA contract is now complete, and its contracts for the eastern and western sectors of the City have begun construction activity.

Since awarding the Sidewalk Repair contract in early November, DOT issued the Notice to Proceed for the contract. Work will begin on DOT projects in February 2025, pending favorable weather. Contractors cannot work on these projects in rain, snow, or freezing temperatures.

## **BALTIMORE CITY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM (BCPSS)**

BCPSS did not install air conditioning in additional classrooms in January because staff needed to prioritize maintaining heat in school buildings during cold temperatures.

The RFP for the MerVo High School football field turf project is still under legal review. The Award for the Edmondson High School, Career and Technical Education (CTE) design project is on track for the March School Board agenda, but the City Springs Replacement Building Design award is still in process with the Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) office, a required step before the Operations Committee and School Board Meetings.

# Performance Measures and Metrics

Table 3 includes a select number of performance measures. Measures should not be viewed as underperforming since many programs or data collection are just beginning. The Recovery Office will continue to coordinate with sub-recipients on measure accuracy.
